Weeks 1–10 | All Subjects: Core (4) + Business Field (4) + Trade Options (6) = 14 Subjects Total

About This Term The Third Term of SS1 Commercial consolidates the full SS1 year and prepares students for SS2. English Language moves into mastery of summary writing, vocabulary development, figures of speech, public speaking/debate, and the expository essay; General Mathematics covers statistics, probability, ratio/proportion/percentages in business, and bearings with trigonometry; Citizenship & Heritage Studies covers national integration, the federal character principle, civic responsibility, and Nigeria's international relations; Digital Technologies covers internet research skills, presentation software, data representation, and digital citizenship; Accounting introduces control accounts, manufacturing and partnership accounts, and final accounts of a sole trader; Commerce covers e-commerce, business ethics, population's effect on trade, and transport; Marketing covers the product life cycle, small-business marketing channels, digital marketing, and marketing ethics; Economics covers national income, taxation, international trade, and unemployment. All 14 subjects are covered across Weeks 1–10. Week 7 is mid-term review/assessment. Week 11 = General Revision; Weeks 12–13 = Examinations.

Note on the Trade Subject (shaded green) As in First and Second Term, every SS1 student offers ONE trade subject in addition to the Business field subjects; all six NERDC-approved options are displayed every week for reference. In the Third Term, each trade subject centres on a single end-of-year practical project that consolidates the skills built across the year: Solar PV Installation & Maintenance (a single-room solar installation), Fashion Design & Garment Making (a traditional Nigerian outfit), Livestock Farming (a small-scale enterprise plan), Beauty & Cosmetology (a complete hair makeover), Computer Hardware & GSM Repairs (a full device repair), and Horticulture & Crop Production (a vegetable or ornamental plot). Each project is planned, executed, documented, and presented at an end-of-year showcase in Weeks 8–9.
